Boston, Oct. 23, 1865.

My Dear Gordon - I fear this will not reach you as your uncle informs me you all leave the end of this month for Boston - I am glad you are coming on & hope you will return - I hope you will delay a few days - We are en route for Dahlonega - We leave about the 1st of Nov. & may go by Savannah, or Charleston & then to Hamletts place for a conveyance & reach your place from 10 to 15th of Nov. - Our Company is in good position & will introduce Pullocks new machine at the Wood Mine wh. mine I will take charge of & maybe the Gaboola also - Will you be good enough to say to Mr. Crismon when we will be on & also ask Mr. Kelgo to survey up my lumber - If you dispose of your cow in any way do not forget us - also if you have anything to sell that we may need in the eating, wood or other line - as we are out of everything

I know we want pitchers & small bowls
- Mrs. D. wants Mrs. Gordon to leave her
space enough to start -

We have just come on from Canada
& are having a pleasant visit with
Uncle Thomas -

I trust you have had a pleasant
Summer will arrive here safely, I do
not expect to ~~see~~ ^{meet} you from what your uncle
says - I believe he will send you some
money for Mr. Bell -

I am hardly able to write you, as I
am suffering from neuralgia in the
head - I trust you are all well -

Mrs. D. joins me in kind love to you
all. We expect a hard time getting
to house keeping again. Believe me
