Boston March 26th 1870

My dear George

Your letter of yesterday's date is received with P. O. Order for Five Dollars, which I have handed to Mr. Beals of the Post, and received the enclosed bill in Exchange. Your "Post" has never been stopped and goes regularly to you every morning. I saw the Mailing Clerk and his book. If it does not come after this let me know I will endeavor to learn the reason why, if the fault is at this end of the line.

Kitty is no better, but we hope she will commence gaining now, as the Dr. day before yesterday injected morphia under the skin of her arm, and she has slept better and seemed to rest more since. Her nerves are still in a terrible state, she is "out of her head" more or less every day and will only allow certain persons to do anything for her. He tried a Nurse but she ~~soon~~ would not like her, and she only stayed a day or two. I hope to

hear better accounts of Ann when
you honor me again with a letter.

Mr Brown enquired for you
and wished to be remembered. He
~~he~~ returned to the Snow Banks of
Berks County this morning before
I was up. Snow Banks and
Sam A. Way's Bank are, I believe, the
only ones in the Country that are not
National (Good joke) I might say
something original on the subject of
Clam Sand & several other Banks
but I spare you
