Charlie just

never wanted to write you

that was my constant prayer  
and my Father heard and in  
his own good time answered  
I feel very thankful for my  
present happiness and while  
trying to forget the past will  
trust in the Lord for the future  
Charles is at work and I have  
two men boarders so we can  
manage by close calculation  
to get along I have paid every  
cent and been able to get Charles  
some pants, boots, Hat, &c. and  
we have a pleasant home and enjoy  
it so much. Of course I have to work  
very hard but am willing to do so  
if my feet trouble me considerably  
I think they may always the left

to be able to get about as well  
as I do now so dont complain  
I would like so much to see  
Agnes would it be possible

out last week a day and Child  
her son remained a few days  
with us I went to see them

she receives the one you  
sent I dont go to Georges although  
we are not far from him I
