## A PROCLAMATION


### PURCHASING MONTH IN GEORGIA

- WHEREAS: The purchasing profession makes significant contributions to the quality, efficiency, and profitability of government and business enterprises in the public and private sectors across the United States; and
- WHEREAS: Managers at all levels draw upon the specialized expertise of purchasing professionals to contribute vital information on forecasting the costs of commodities and services, keeping abreast of market conditions, availability, and technological advancements; and
- WHEREAS: Purchasing professionals provide pertinent information important to the feasibility, practicality, cost-effectiveness, make-or-buy decisions, timing, and other critical planning considerations and objectives which enhance strategic organizational goals and direction; and
- WHEREAS: The purchasing profession is a key business element in a market-driven economy that fosters fair and open competition to provide the best quality products, at the best price and at the right time; and
- WHEREAS: In addition to the purchase of commercial goods and services, the purchasing profession engages in or provides consultation for functions such as awarding, implementing, and administering contracts; developing procurement strategies and fostering good partnerships with suppliers and other entities within their organization; and
- WHEREAS: The purchasing profession has significant influence on economics in Georgia with an accumulative purchasing power in the billions of dollars; and
- WHEREAS: The State Purchasing organization in the Department of Administrative Services along with other purchasing organizations within the State of Georgia will be hosting activities and special events to further educate and inform the general public about the role of purchasing within business, industry and government; now
- THEREFORE: I, Zell Miller, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim the month of March 1998 as "PURCHASING MONTH IN GEORGIA" throughout our state.
